## Recruitment **Open for 2025/26**

Recruitment for next year's courses opened on 8th October and interviews are already underway.

We will be adding several additional courses to the GITEP Portfolio including Computing, Business Studies and Business Economics, Music and Psychology.

The government has released details of the bursaries it will be offering for next year, and several professional bodies have confirmed scholarships.

#### **Centre Professional Studies**

At the start of the academic year, trainees spent several days together in Centre Professional Studies to kick start their training year. Sessions covered the local education context, responding to feedback, cognitive load theory, the Equality Act, wellbeing and the ethics of teaching. Before starting their placement visits, trainees took part in the first Intensive Training and Practice (ITAP) week which was focused on Behaviour and High Expectations.

Trainees looked in antecedents including 'Pastore's perch', 'narrate the positive' and 'least invasive intervention' as well as observing expert colleagues in some partnership schools.

Our Primary trainees have been busy this term, getting to know their schools and building positive relationships with their classes. They have been developing their knowledge in effective teaching and learning through their centre-based training. Sessions have allowed trainees to explore:

- The Early Years and National Curriculums
- Developing professional language
- Understanding the impact of a 'Schwa' in the teaching of Phonics!

Last week we embarked on our first ITAP, focusing on High Expectations and Behaviour Management. We looked deeply at the EEF guidance in improving behaviour in schools and thought critically about the recommendations. We had great fun visiting Springbank Primary Academy to see them in action.

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#### School-based Professional Studies

This term during School-based Professional Studies (SBPS) with their Professional Leads, trainees have had sessions on:

- Induction
- **SEND**
- School data
- Pastoral Provision.

SBPS is an important part of our trainees' year; these evidence-informed sessions are planned by GITEP and delivered by PLs.



They have been designed so that trainees can make links with their learning in other elements of the programme and to their practice in placement schools. Well done to all trainees on the first Bundle conversations and thanks to our PLs for running the SBPS curriculum and assessing Bundles.

#### **Subject Pathway**



In Subject Pathway sessions during this half term, trainees have focused on exploring fundamental components of the subject curriculum and pedagogy. Sessions have included:

- · Substantive and disciplinary knowledge
- · National Curriculum and exam specifications
- · How pupils learn and lesson planning
- · Formative and summative assessment principles
- · Developing subject knowledge.

Subject Pathway sessions are a valuable opportunity for trainees to come together each week, expertly guided by the GITEP Subject Leads, building a community for subject-specific professional learning and support. From next half term, as trainees begin teaching, they will increasingly be able to apply their learning directly into their practice in school. Mentors play a crucial role in this by discussing learning from their Thursday subject sessions and how this might impact on their practice during the weekly mentor meeting and by reading the weekly email from the subject lead. In addition, the weekly lead emails have useful information and links for mentors' own professional development.
